Thoughts from our Pastoral Administrator

God continues to bless us with four seasons of weather in one week! Monday, I ran the walking/bike paths of the Huron River Metro Park before the afternoon rains hit. Tuesday, I traveled to Beal City for the funeral of Joanne Smith, wife of Deacon Mike Smith. While riding in the car and viewing the countryside, our conversations included how everything pointed to Spring and it seemed more like the end of April than early February. We hadn't forgotten the forecast for more ice and snow, and as Fr. T.J. promised, we had another Wednesday with no school and no morning Mass or Word & Communion Service. God certainly has a sense of humor!

We have been working for some time with a vendor to provide a new security system for Blessed Trinity. After several months of reviewing options, installation will begin this week. The new system will tie in with our current alarm system, eliminate the need for key access to the building (key fobs will be used for this purpose and also for temporary use like rental of the social hall), provide for a more secure facility, video monitoring, and connection to our computer system. This will provide a safer environment for staff during the day, especially when only one or two people are in the building. I'm sure it will take some getting used to, so please be patient with us as we familiarize ourselves with it together.

Many times we may see landmarks or monuments that go by different names. The Sears Tower in Chicago, for example, was sold in 2009 and re-named the Willis Tower by the new owners. I'm not sure the directions you may be given if trying to find your way there. Many stadiums, for example, sell their naming rights and can be difficult to follow or identify. In our Gospel reading this weekend, Jesus appears at Lake Gennesaret. If this doesn't sound familiar, it's also known as the Sea of Tiberias and the Sea of Galilee. This setting provides for a familiar reading from Luke, telling us (in part) about Simon, who was Simon Peter prior to Jesus naming him Peter. This was not the first time Simon met Jesus.

Prior to this story, we find in Luke that Jesus healed Simon's mother-in-law. After witnessing two signs from Jesus, we get a better idea why he responded the way he did. He felt unworthy, sinful and humiliated. Jesus responds with the famous reply, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." Think about that one moment in time; how powerful it is and the same time the level of anxiety of that statement. They left everything and followed him.

Jesus always reaches out to the lowly, weak and needy. He fills their hearts and souls with His love and compassion, enabling them and us to carry out His mission....our mission....offering the Good News of the Lord. What are we willing to do differently to follow Jesus and the way of the cross?

Thoughts from our Sacramental Minister

Greetings from your Sacramental Minister! I would like to share a few things with you this week:

- I am currently on vacation and will be back on February 13. I have always tried to take a week off during the winter season, because I like winter and snow (I hope to go snowshoeing if there is adequate snow). I'm not much of a traveler, so I am staying right around my Merrill home (I am known as a homebody!).
- ♦ I am gone this weekend, so I have asked Fr. Jose Cabrera to celebrate Saturday's 5:00 p.m. Mass with you. Fr. Thom Kowalczyk will be here on Sunday to celebrate both Masses with you. You are in good hands!
- All priests are required to attend an annual retreat. I will be attending the Saginaw Diocese Priest's Retreat from February 17 - 21. While I am at this gathering, I will keep all of you in my prayers.
- Deacon Larry will offer a Word & Communion Service on Wednesday, February 20 while I am away.

To answer the question.....why am I here as a Sacramental Minister? This question arises, I believe, from the fact that I have been a priest of the Saginaw Diocese for 33 years, and now I am serving Blessed Trinity Parish as a Sacramental Minister. Here, I share my situation with you.

The last five months of 2018, I was on sick leave. I was at the St. John Vianney Center in Downingtown, Pennsylvania, diagnosed with total burnout. Burnout affects one's mental being. Physically, I am fine, but mentally, I am still healing. It will take time to fully recover.

I am in a one-year program where I meet weekly with my therapist and monthly with my support team as a whole. I also meet monthly with my Spiritual Director and with my Confessor. The purpose of this year is to slowly acclimate me back into public ministry. I ask for your continued prayers.

Faith Formation News

Our grade 2 students and their parents will meet today/Sunday from 1:30 - 3:00 p.m. to learn more about the Sacrament of Confirmation.

You might wonder what cooking oil, gasoline, Chrism Oil, and hand lotion have in common. The answer is OIL! And you might ask what oil has to do with Confirmation.

During the Confirmation Liturgy, the Bishop or his representative (this year it will be Regional Vicar, Fr. Pete Gaspeny) anoints the children with Chrism Oil. Fr. Pete will ask the Holy Spirit to bless the children and strengthen them in their faith. We might remember our Confirmation when we see others anointed with Chrism. May the Holy Spirit renew us in our faith and revive our spirits during these dark winter days!

At today's gathering, the students will learn all about the use of Chrism Oil in the sacrament of Confirmation. Other activities include a Holy Spirit race and a Holy Spirit snack. We also have seven mystery boxes for them to explore while they learn about the Gifts of the Spirit.

On February 19, our grade 3 students will travel to Medilodge of Frankenmuth to visit with the residents from 3:00 - 4:30 p.m. Parents should please check your child's folder for the permission slip and return it ASAP. If you are able to help by driving and chaperoning, please return that form as well. And please remember to send one package of store-bought cookies for your child to share at Medilodge.


